# **AFRICAN FOODWAYS**

## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Participate in a culinary journey throughout the African Diaspora to learn how African heritage has been preserved through food. Some concepts to be explored:

- 1. What is the Columbian exchange?
- 2. Did slave owners incorporate slave dishes into their eating patterns?
- 3. Do today's African Americans eat the same foods Africans ate centuries ago?
- 4. What was the relationship between African cultivated grain crops and the Atlantic slave trade?
- 5. How did African slaves contribute to South Carolina's early economic success?
- 6. What was the importance of pepper in the Africans lives?
- 7. How has the Atlantic slave trade ultimately affected European Americans and Native Americans throughout the hemisphere?

## **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

Participants will:

- Discuss the complicated origins of African, African Caribbean and African American dishes.
- Examine the material and symbolic power of foods represented throughout the African Diaspora.
- Explore rituals and stereotypes associated with the food.
- Analyze the intersections of foodways with history and culture.
- Consider the relationships between literary and culinary studies.
- Encourage and support learning through reflection.
